MENTORSHIP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

October 2010 – May 2111

- October: orientation and three-week independent study period online
- Late Oct-Dec: online coursework and discussions with faculty and peers requiring an average of nine to 12 hours of study per week
- December: refine your clinical reasoning and handling skills at a weekend lab session in Hayward (San Francisco Bay Area)
- January – May:
 - Continue online coursework and case study projects nine to 12 hours per week
 - Work for a Kaiser Northwest clinic two days per week while receiving ongoing one-on-one mentoring
 - Maintain your current employment in the Portland area two to three days per week
 - Attend weekend lab sessions every five to six weeks at Kaiser Hayward to refine your clinical reasoning and handling skills

TUITION & STIPEND

Tuition is \$2,750. You'll receive a stipend of \$21.36 per hour for providing no more than 20 hours per week of patient care at a Kaiser Northwest clinic.
